[All children in base positions on stage as shown in suggested stage layout. FLUTTERPILLAR enters as NARRATOR speaks, goes to Centre Stage.]

NARRATOR 1 Once there was a little caterpillar. She was not a...

FLOWERS (arms wide) BIG...

NARRATOR 1 ...caterpillar. She was a...

FLOWERS (hands close together) SMALL...

NARRATOR 1caterpillar. She didn't have any...

FLOWERS (wave) HANDS,


NARRATOR 1 And she didn't have any...


FLOWERS (touch hair) HAIR.

NARRATOR 1 But she did have lots and lots of...

FLOWERS (waggle alternate feet) FEET!

<u>LOTS AND LOTS OF FEET</u> (⊙ Track 1 / 7)





NARRATOR 2 The little caterpillar loved eating cakes and chocolates.

FLOWERS No she didn't!

[FLUTTERPILLAR shakes her head, walks to Stage Left.]

NARRATOR 2 What <u>did</u> she eat then?


[Option: some children could take leaves to FLUTTERPILLAR.]

FLOWERS Leaves!

[FLUTTERPILLAR puts thumbs up, walks towards bush.]

NARRATOR 2 Oh yes, that's right. She loved eating juicy, green leaves. And every day she ate more and more.

[During the song, FLUTTERPILLAR mimes eating leaves from the bush. **Option:** first verse could be sung solo.]



I LIKE TO EAT.

I LIKE TO MUNCH.

I LIKE TO CRUNCH AND CHEW AND SWALLOW.

BIG, GREEN LEAVES ARE THE VERY BEST.

GIVE ME HALF A LETTUCE

I WILL EAT THE REST!

LOVELY <u>LETTUCE</u> LEAVES

JUST FOR ME.

I'LL EAT THEM FOR BREAKFAST (Yum, yum!)

AND DINNER AND TEA. (spoken) Mmm! Yum, yum!

...Yum!

[FLUTTERPILLAR goes to Centre, rubs tummy.]

Rub tummies

Thumbs up

NARRATOR 1 After all that eating, the little caterpillar was <u>not</u> so little.

FLOWERS She was getting very <u>big!</u>

[BUTTERFLY 1 enters, dances over towards Stage R.]

NARRATOR 2 She was just rubbing her tummy - and feeling very full -

when she noticed a beautiful insect fluttering past.

FLUTTERPILLAR (points at BUTTERFLY 1) I wish I could fly like that!

[BUTTERFLY 1 flutters wings and dances around bush.

FLUTTERPILLAR goes to join BUTTERFLY 1.]

What's your name?

BUTTERFLY 1 (still fluttering) Butterfly.

FLUTTERPILLAR Flutterby?

BUTTERFLY 1 (shaking head) No, not Flutterby. It's butterfly!

[FLUTTERPILLAR returns to C., scratching head. Practises the word 'flutterby' to herself in a whisper as NARRATOR speaks.]

NARRATOR 1 Little caterpillar found it very hard to say 'butterfly'.

She needed some help!

NARRATOR 2 Along came her friends, Mouse, Deer, Fox and Squirrel.

[Enter MOUSE, DEER, FOX & SQUIRREL, with props.]

DEER We've come to help you say 'butterfly'.

MOUSE Butterfly begins with <u>butter</u>. (holding up buttercup) Like a buttercup.

FLUTTERPILLAR (nods slowly) OK.

FOX Or butternut squash!

[FOX holds up butternut squash.]
