GONG (⊙ Track 18) [Enter VIZIER.]

VIZIER The executioner is waiting for your orders, Great Sultan.

DINAZADE O Great Sultan, wouldn't you like to hear <u>one</u> more story?

VIZIER Will you permit this, O Great One?

SULTAN Perhaps one more. Come back tomorrow – same time.

SCENE 10 1001 Tales

CHRIS What fantastic tales! No wonder the Sultan kept wanting more!

SAMMY Did Scheherazade have many more to tell?

CHRIS Any <u>gruesome</u> ones?

OLD MAN She certainly did. She went on telling them for a thousand nights.

SAMMY / CHRIS A thousand nights?

OLD MAN A thousand and one, in fact. And each tale was different from

the last.

SAMMY And each one saved her from being killed...

CHRIS Or someone else...

SAMMY What an amazing person she was.

OLD MAN Indeed, a brave and clever person. Come with me, I'll show you

some more.

[OLD MAN can pick up a fiddle from the shelf, and 'play' along with the music, or simply hold the open book, as he leads SAMMY & CHRIS around the edges of a dance (slowly, so as not to detract from the movement). The children point and whisper in response to the dance. Meanwhile, SCHEHERAZADE mimes story-telling, with hand gestures, etc.]

The dance might represent any stories from the Arabian Nights, eg Aladdin, Sinbad, the Enchanted Horse, etc., or could re-use the characters from the tales we have just seen. Alternatively, it could simply be a dance with an eastern flavour, perhaps having a magic carpet theme and using strips of colourful chiffon cloth as props.

[After 2:30 mins cue CAST to join in – at 2:39 – for the finish:]

[DANCERS draw back from their finish positions to 'frozen' positions in groups upstage. OLD MAN, SAMMY & CHRIS return to Al's Place, speaking as they move.]

SAMMY But what happened after that?

CHRIS After a thousand and one nights?

OLD MAN Scheherazade couldn't think of any more stories.

SAMMY Oh no! What did the Sultan do?

CHRIS (concerned - not bloodthirsty!) He didn't kill her, did he?

[OLD MAN points to SCHEHERAZADE, who moves to Centre. SAMMY & CHRIS turn to look at her, sitting to watch her sing. During the song, SULTAN & CAST fall asleep, but not characters needing to be awake!]

SCENE 11 No More Songs

NO MORE SONGS (⊙ Track 15)
